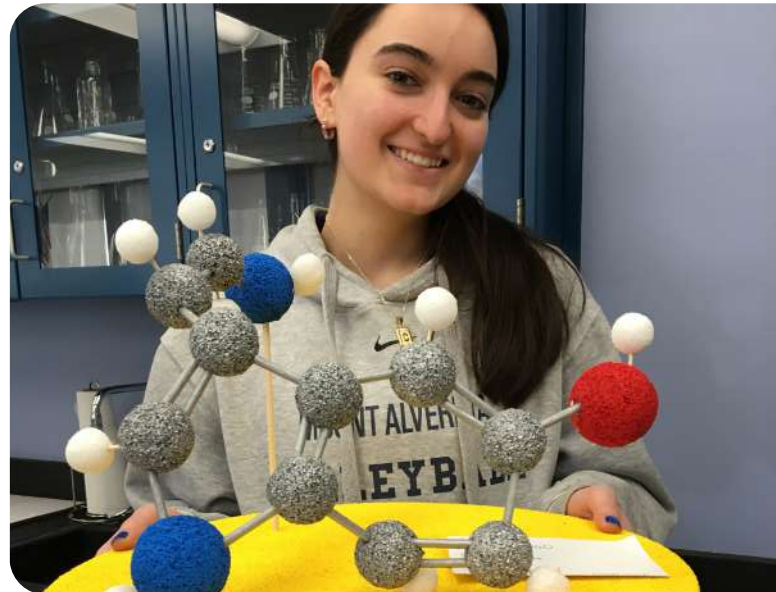

Campus Ministry Picks Up Where They Left Off

Core to who we are as a school, service has remained a priority at 790 Centre Street. In February, 34 students participated in Winter Walk Boston to support those who are homeless. In addition to walking the freezing streets of Boston, over \$500 was raised through a tag day at the school.

Throughout the winter and spring months, the students of campus ministry were very giving of their time. On several occasions the Pine Street Inn, a homeless shelter for men and women of Boston, was the beneficiary of the students' time. In addition to serving the meals, the students presented the guests with homemade Valentine's Day cards and desserts.



The students also spent their time with the Capuchin Mobile Ministries, an outreach to poor, homeless, and marginalized populations of Boston and around the world. Time was also spent making Valentine's Day boxes of cookies, candy, and toys for underprivileged children of Boston through the Yawkey Center in Dorchester and Mother's Day cards as part of a fundraiser for Boston's Women's Lunch Place, a day shelter for women.

Continuing the long standing MAHS connection with Cradles to Crayons, this past May the middle school students went to work at the Brighton location. Between the 7th and 8th grade classes, over 77 large bins of clothing were sorted and organized.



Track and Field Comes Back Strong

The Mustang track and field team had quite a bounceback season after not fielding a competitive team since 2019. Under the guidance of Coach Rob Ackerman, 17 athletes competed in a full slate of events. Many of the athletes recorded personal bests throughout the season laying the groundwork for seasons to come.

Mustangs Participate in Their Inaugural Lacrosse Season

MAHS launched a lacrosse club team this past spring. Due to the overwhelming number of participants and on field success, a full varsity program will be in place for spring 2023. Coach Rich Monbouquette and Coach Elizabeth Bennett stated the girls worked extremely hard during their skill sessions as well as during their competitions that were led by several promising underclasswomen.



From Ukraine to Centre Street

For the past 25 years, the Finegold family has been part of the Mount Alvernia family. In the fall of 1999, Helen Finegold '05 came to 790 Centre Street as a seventh grader. It did not take long before her mother, Mrs. Tanya Finegold, began volunteering.

"My first time volunteering was helping with the Prom Fashion Show book," recalls Mrs. Finegold. "I didn't even know what it was." Then-technology director, Mrs. Barbara Flanagan, P'90, P'94, warmly welcomed Mrs. Finegold's help. In 2003, Mrs. Flanagan retired and Mrs. Finegold moved into the technology director role. Under Mrs. Finegold's leadership, Mount Alvernia's technology has continued to grow and expand to meet the needs of students.

In recent months, the Finegold family has been contacted by many in the Mount Alvernia community to share their love and support as the Finegold's beloved homeland of Ukraine was invaded by Russia.

In 1991, just before the fall of the Soviet Union, the Finegold family left Donetsk, Ukraine. It was her father-in-law's dream to escape Soviet rule. Her husband shared that dream of democracy and freedom. The opportunity came, but at a high price. To leave Ukraine, they had to give up their citizenship and were told they could never return or see family. Only months later, in August 1991, Ukraine was the first country to gain independence from the Soviet Union.

After living first in Israel and then in South America, the Finegolds came to Massachusetts in 1995. Around the same time, Mrs. Finegold was volunteering for the Chernobyl Children's Project. The organization's mission was to bring children who had been exposed to nuclear radiation from the 1986 disaster to the Boston area for a month of nutrition, medical attention, and healthy living. Mrs. Finegold served as an interpreter and there met the Cunningham family and Sister Marie Puleo, MFIC, who were also working with the organization. Emily Cunningham '01 was a then-current Mount Alvernia student, and her sister, Kara '08 would later follow in her footsteps. Their mother and Sister Marie shared their love of the Mount Alvernia community with Mrs. Finegold. Like with many families, word of mouth led the Finegolds to enroll Helen at Mount Alvernia.



On May 19, 2008, Helen and Mrs. Finegold became United States citizens at the Hynes Convention Center. It was a celebratory day for them and for their extended Mount Alvernia family. Teachers attended the naturalization ceremony, and then-principal Mrs. Kathy Kent offered a champagne toast on campus in honor of their new citizenship.

Mrs. Finegold's most recent trip to Ukraine was in 2019. Prior to the pandemic, Mrs. Finegold traveled often to see her father and extended family. In 2012, Helen joined her. Looking through an album created by Helen of the trip, Mrs. Finegold shared stories of places that look very different now—most especially the capital city of Kiev.

Since the war began, the Finegold's family in Ukraine has been helping frontline soldiers and refugees in Babyntsi. With so many people reaching out to Helen and Mrs. Finegold, they knew they wanted to find a way to help from the United States. Members of the Missionary Franciscan Sisters gave Mrs. Finegold funds and asked her to send it to whomever needed it in Ukraine. From there the idea grew. Helen established a GoFundMe page to support their family's work feeding and housing refugees, mostly women and children. More than \$26,000 has been raised to date.

"The least we can do is send funds to help bolster the already incredible work my family is doing on the ground in Ukraine to help others. They have already exhausted their own food storage and personal savings."

In addition to the funds raised, the Finegold family has received many prayers, messages, and acts of love. Students who see Mrs. Finegold around the campus will see she is often wearing the colors of the Ukrainian flag—even her nail polish is blue and yellow. And around her neck is a scarf with the same colors knit by Sister Margaret Henry, MFIC.

"Sister Margaret told me every stitch is a prayer for Ukraine," Mrs. Finegold said through tears.

STEAM CURRICULUM GETS A BOOST

Through the generous support of all those who contributed to the Sister Anna Theresa Fund for STEAM Initiatives, we have some exciting updates to share about the learning environment at Mount Alvernia. Beginning this September, we will be implementing changes to our existing STEAM program. There will be a number of notable changes to the curriculum as well as the physical spaces for the upcoming school year.

Science curriculum changes will include the debut of an eighth grade engineering course, grant-funded STEM AP course opportunities through the Virtual High School (VHS) program, and the initial steps in resequencing the grades 9-11 courses to introduce all high school students to biology, chemistry, and physics in addition to our elective offerings.



In addition to the updated science curriculum, we have added two new programs to enhance academic opportunities available to students. An individualized math program has been introduced, which will allow for additional math support and rigor for each student. We also have partnered with NEXTGENPRENEUR, a program dedicated to guiding young women to become leaders, innovators, and entrepreneurs. Students will engage in the first module of entrepreneurship and social impact, which teaches participants how to develop and promote an idea or product that will solve a social problem. Students will learn how to research, market, develop, and “pitch” their idea or product. After this module, students will transition to a financial literacy series.

At this school year’s closing prayer service and book award presentations, surrounded by fellow faculty and staff, students and even a few returning alumnae, it was announced that Sister Michele Craig, MFIC and Mrs. Julie (Sullivan) Gosselin ’83, P’16 have been selected as the 2022 Seven C’s Award recipients. Both women will be formally honored at the 3rd Annual Gala on October 22nd at the Brae Burn Country Club. Sister Michele has been a welcoming presence at 790 Centre Street for the past 16 years and Mrs. Gosselin is celebrating her 25th year as the school’s athletic director. Class of 2022 Celebrated



On an unseasonably hot May 21st, faculty, staff, friends and families were all on hand to celebrate the accomplishments and graduation of the Class of 2022. This year's graduation marked the 83rd for MAHS and was the 50th held at 790 Centre Street. For the first time since 2019, the graduation returned to the upper field in front of the Saint Francis statue.

Salutatorian Ariana Contessi welcomed the more than 300 guests with her remarks. "Obviously, we have come a long way—from anxiously walking the halls in seventh grade, to soon walking across this stage to receive our diplomas. We appreciate you all for supporting and guiding us from those first moments to now, and every step of the way," said Contessi.

The pleasant surprise of the afternoon came when Christina DiRuzza, class valedictorian, took the opportunity to create an 8th C. She explained, "We are a group of 26 young women, who embody the 7C's of Mount Alvernia better than anybody that I know. And now... I'm going to add a C: Continuation! Because this is not the end, it is only the beginning of a lifetime of sharing our gifts and talents with the world. Guided by God's light, we are ready to take what we have learned here at 790 Centre Street out into a whole new world of possibility."

Members of the Class of 2022 were accepted at 89 universities and colleges throughout the United States, as well as in Canada and Europe. They were also a group that was awarded almost \$11,000,000 in grants, financial aid, and merit scholarships.

ADMINISTRATORS ATTEND GLOBAL FORUM ON GIRLS' EDUCATION III

The Boston Park Plaza was the setting for the International Coalition of Girls' Schools, 3rd Global Forum on Girls' Education on June 27 – 29. The event was attended by a record number of educators from girls' schools from almost every continent. As a member school of this coalition, Mount Alvernia attendees included Head of School, Ms. Jillian Boudreau, Assistant Head of School, Mrs. Mary Bridget Chick, and Director of Admissions, Mrs. Kimberly Kossuth. Held in both a virtual and in-person format, the educators, researchers, advocates, authors, and practitioners from around

the world convened and shared ideas about how best to prepare and empower girls to be ethical, globally minded changemakers who lead with courage, competence, and empathy. Reflecting on the experience, Ms. Boudreau stated, "It was a wonderful opportunity, especially after the pandemic, to meet educators from all over the world, who can all relate to educating girls. In my short time there, I met educators from New York, California, Washington DC, Hawaii, Texas, England, Australia, and beyond, who all had the same common goal—empowering young women to find their strengths and become a force for good in the world. Dear Mount Alvernia High School Community,

As we embark upon our 50th year on Centre Street, I proudly share with you Mount Alvernia High School's Head of School Report for the Fiscal Year 2021. Credit is due to former Interim Head of School Mrs. Nicole Pascarelli O'Brien for her leadership during an unprecedented, but also very successful year.

It was an eventful time as we began with a hybrid school model, and transitioned for the fall back to fully-in-person learning. Despite the challenging times, the support and generosity of the Mount Alvernia High School Community has remained steadfast.

After a yearlong pause due to the pandemic, we were happy to host two of our largest fundraisers, the Prom Fashion Show and annual Golf Tournament. With more than three decades of history, the Prom Fashion Show returned in March, funding scholarships awarded at Foundress Day, followed by our spring golf tournament, which allowed for a large gathering of our generous school supporters for the first time this year.

One of our greatest successes came in the areas of grants, which strongly supported the Sister Celestine Coyle Fund for Financial Aid. A special thank you to the Canadian Province of the Missionary Franciscan Sisters who presented the school with two generous awards toward this fund. A thank

you to our school community as well, as the donations from our families increased by almost 10% and contributions from the senior class was up 5% from the previous year.

As it did last year, the COVID-19 pandemic affected our Mount Alvernia families in a myriad of ways. Families have needed additional support through our financial aid fund and our emergency fund. We are grateful to have these funds available thanks to the generosity of so many donors.

Every gift makes a difference to our school and ensures our mission continues to thrive at 790 Centre Street. 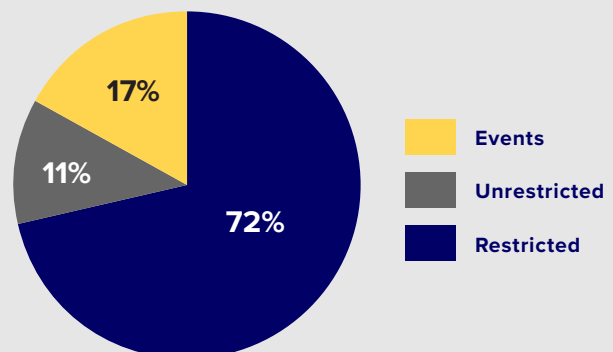
